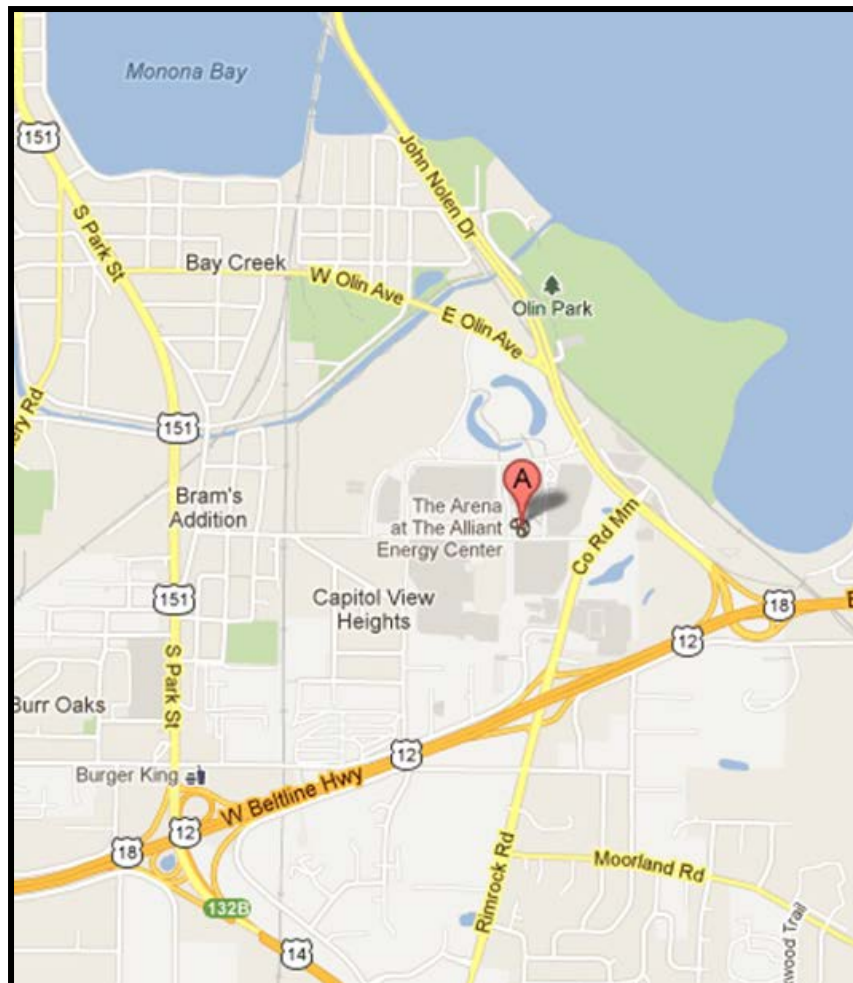

- From Chicago take I-90 West; From Minneapolis take I-94 East; From Milwaukee take I-94 West.
 - Exit West from these onto Hwy 12/18 (the Beltline).
 - Exit North on John Nolen Drive or Rimrock Road. The Alliant Energy Center is located at the bottom of each exit.
- From Iowa enter Madison on Hwy 12/18 or Hwy 14 which runs into Hwy 12/18.
 - From Hwy 12/18 (the Beltline) exit North on John Nolen Drive or Rimrock Road. The Alliant Energy Center is located at the bottom of each exit.

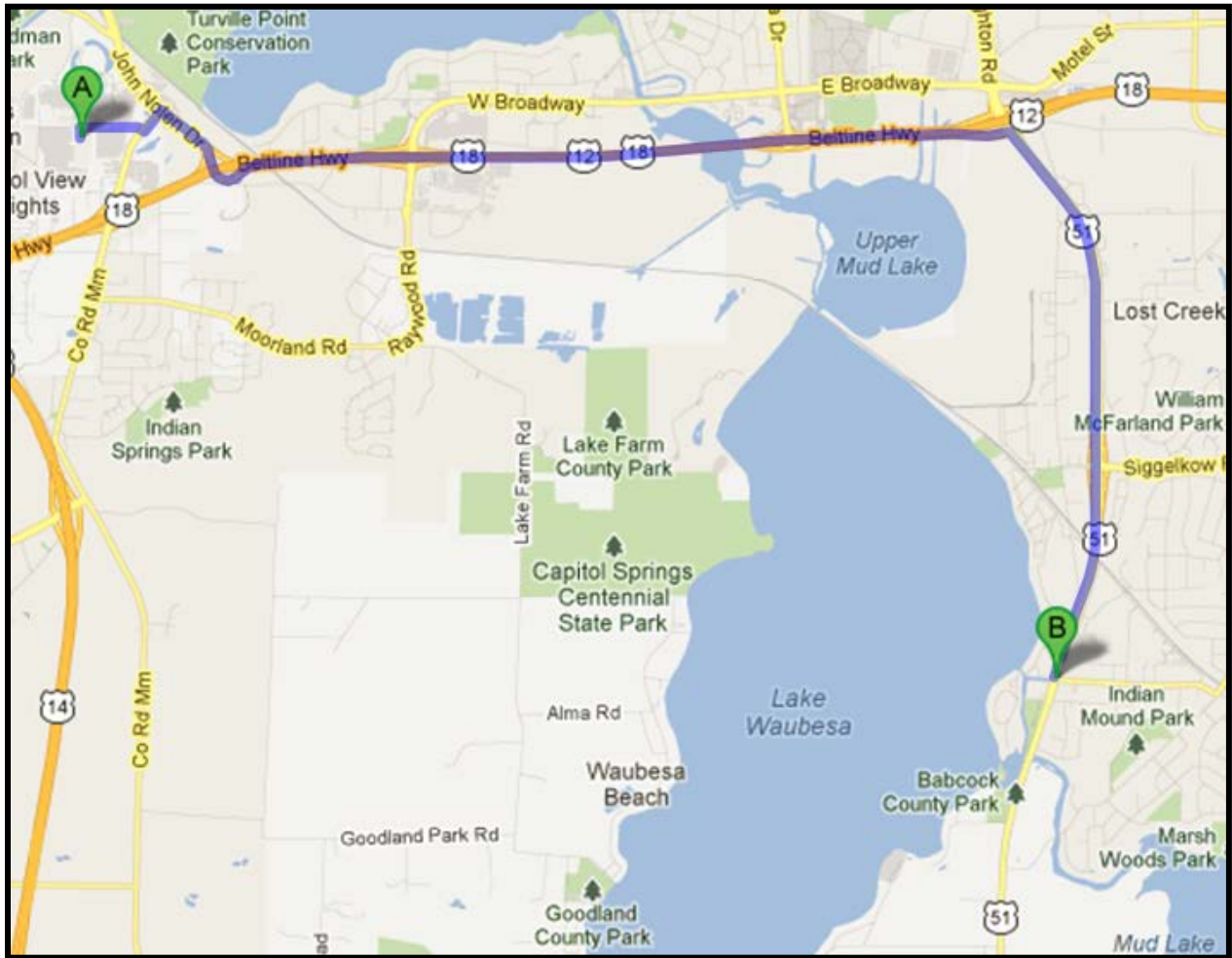


Maple Tree Supper club

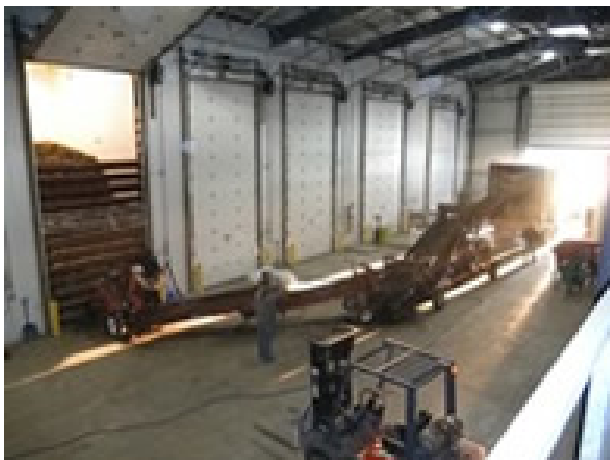
Details from the August 13th Meeting

Secretary's Report

08 Sept 2014

Every summer, ASABE members were invited to attend the WALSAA (Wisconsin Agricultural and Life Sciences Alumni Association) hosted picnic held in conjunction with Wisconsin Farm Technology Days. This year, the farm show was held in Portage County and the picnic was hosted by the UW-Hancock Agricultural Research Station on Wednesday, August 19th following the show.

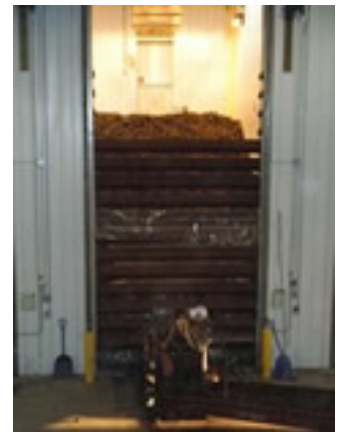
Many alumni gathered on their way home from the farm show to meet and enjoy a picnic dinner on a pleasant summer afternoon. Afterwards, staff at the station gave guided wagon tours of the fields and facilities. The Hancock Research Station is located in the Central Sands region of Wisconsin, making it a prime location especially for many vegetable crops such as potatoes, sweet corn, snap beans and carrots. Research at the station began in 1916 and it now encompasses 412 acres and is home to numerous test plots as well as an advanced potato and vegetable storage research facility. The group was able to take a look inside the impressive storage building that was built in 2006 and holds over 200,000 lbs. of bulk-piled potatoes for year-round research.



A look inside at several of the computer climate controlled bins used for potato storage research. The research station is a large part of the Wisconsin Potato Variety and Advanced Selection Evaluation Trial that is held annually and is of huge benefit to area growers.

Potatoes starch/sugar content must be carefully monitored throughout the storage process and levels or changes dictate when the potatoes must be moved out to the processing facility. Here workers

begin to unload a bulk bin following a period of storage around 45°F that may last well over 6 months.
